## RECOMMENDED ACTION(S):

Authorize the County Procurement Officer or Deputized designee to execute Amendment Number Two to the contract with Range Ordinance Cleanup LLC for lead remediation services, for a one-year term effective July 26, 2026, through July 25, 2027, in an amount not to exceed \$300,000, for a new cumulative amount of \$1,500,000.

## SUMMARY:

Approval of Amendment Number Two to the contract with Range Ordinance Cleanup LLC will allow the Sheriff-Coroner Department to continue to provide lead remediation and cleaning of pistol ranges.

## BACKGROUND INFORMATION:

Firing ranges generate hazardous waste in the form of spent ammunition, which contain lead. Removing lead minimizes environmental impact and eliminates regulatory concerns. The Sheriff-Coroner Department (Sheriff) requires lead remediation and clean-up services at three shooting ranges, two mobile pistol ranges and one forensic test range.

Sheriff has been contracting for lead remediation services since 2008. The most recent bid solicitation for lead remediation and clean-up of pistol ranges was issued from March 9, 2022, through April 11, 2022, and three bids were received. The bids were evaluated, and Range Ordinance Cleanup LLC (Range) was deemed to be the most responsive, responsible bidder.

The contract with Range provides for lead remediation and clean-up services at three shooting ranges, two mobile pistol ranges and one forensic test range. All hazardous waste disposal is conducted to the satisfaction of the California Department of Toxic Substances Control and in accordance with all pertinent federal, state and local codes and regulations.

Sheriff now requests Board approval to execute Amendment Number Two to renew the contract with Range for lead remediation and cleanup of pistol ranges for a one-year term effective July 26, 2026, through July 25, 2027, in the not to exceed amount of \$300,000, for a new cumulative amount of \$1.5 million, as noted in the Recommended Action. This is the last renewal year of the contract. Prior to contract expiration, Sheriff will issue an Invitation for Bid Solicitation to continue with these services. The Orange County Preference Policy is not applicable to this renewal amendment.

Contractor performance has been confirmed as satisfactory. Sheriff has verified there are no concerns that must be addressed with respect to the contractor's ownership/name, litigation status or conflicts with County interests. This contractor does not currently include subcontractors or pass through to other providers. See Attachment B for the Contract Summary Form.

**Compliance with CEQA:** The proposed project was previously determined to be categorically exempt from CEQA pursuant to Section 15330 (Class 30) of the CEQA Guidelines, on May 6, 2025, when it was originally approved because it provides for any minor cleanup actions taken to prevent, minimize, stabilize, mitigate, or eliminate the release or threat of release of a hazardous waste or substance which are small or medium removal actions costing \$1 million or less. The proposed project is still consistent with this determination.

**FINANCIAL IMPACT:**

Appropriations for this contract are being requested in the Sheriff-Coroner Department's FY 2026-27 Budget for Budget Control 060, and in the budgeting process for future years. The contract is contingent upon funding availability. In the event funding is reduced or terminated, the County may renegotiate the level of services and/or terminate the contract, as necessary.
