RECOMMENDED ACTION(S):

1. Approve the allocation of \$250,000 from Fifth District discretionary funds to Planned Parenthood Orange and San Bernardino Counties, Inc. to support contraceptive access for Fifth District residents.2. Find under Government Code section 26227 that this expenditure is necessary to meet the public health and social needs of County residents.3. Authorize and direct the County Executive Officer, or designee, to negotiate and enter into an agreement with Planned Parenthood Orange and San Bernardino Counties, Inc. as necessary to effectuate the purposes of this allocation.4. Authorize and direct the Auditor Controller, or designee, to make related payments as necessary to effectuate the purposes of this allocation.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION:

Summary: Vice Chair Foley requests approval for the allocation of \$250,000 from the Fifth District discretionary funds to support Planned Parenthood Orange and San Bernardino Counties, Inc. for contraceptive access for Fifth District residents.

Purpose of Funding: Planned Parenthood Orange and San Bernardino Counties, Inc. is a 501(c)(3) nonprofit community clinic that provides reproductive health care, preventive care, education, and related health services for residents in Orange and San Bernardino Counties. The organization operates the Costa Mesa Health Center, which serves as its Planned Parenthood health center located in the Fifth District. This funding will support contraceptive access for Fifth District residents by funding a defined contraceptive care budget. The allocation will support injectable birth control, contraceptive patches, intrauterine devices, contraceptive rings, birth control pills, emergency contraceptive pills, and contraceptive implants.

Access to contraception remains a public health priority for Fifth District residents, including residents who are uninsured, underinsured, or facing barriers to preventive health care. The allocation will help preserve

timely access to contraceptive care, reduce barriers for patients regardless of ability to pay, and support reproductive health outcomes for residents served through the Costa Mesa Health Center.
