County of Orange Report on Grant Applications/Awards

The Grants Report is a condensed list of grant requests by County Agencies/Departments that allows the Board of Supervisors to discuss and approve grant submittals in one motion at a Board meeting. County policy dictates that the Board of Supervisors must approve all grant applications prior to submittal to the grantor. This applies to grants of all amounts, as well as to new grants and those that have been received by the County for many years as part of an ongoing grant. Receipt of grants \$50,000 or less is delegated to the County Executive Officer. Grant awards greater than \$50,000 must be presented to the Board of Supervisors for receipt of funds. This report allows for better tracking of county grant requests, the success rate of our grants, and monitoring of County's grants activities. It also serves to inform Orange County's Sacramento and Washington, D.C. advocates of County grant activities involving the State or Federal Governments.

The California Department of Public Health (CDPH), Maternal, Child, and Adolescent Health (MCAH) California Home Visiting Program (CHVP) is offering a grant award to implement innovative home visiting or home visiting related programs/projects with a focus on meeting a locally identified challenge in providing relevant, responsive, well-integrated home visiting services to pregnant and parenting families in their communities. Projects will focus on public health strategies to improve support to evidenced-based home visiting models not otherwise funded by CDPH/CHVP. The Community and Nursing Services Division's (CNSD) proposed project will fund a Public Health Nurse to provide home visitation and case management services focusing on perinatal stabilization for pregnant or post-partum clients

experiencing substance use disorder (SUD). The goal of the project is to stabilize impacted clients and serve as the liaison to continue implementation of the Family Wellness Plans (Plans of Safe Care) within the different hospital systems within Orange County. The Public Health Nurse (PHN) will provide short-term case management connecting and linking clients to SUD services, providing assessments to mother and child addressing factors that impact health, and providing other critical interventions and referrals to community services. CNSD is experienced in providing home visitation to the MCAH populations through CNSD programs serving pregnant and parenting women, and children ages birth to three years. This grant will allow CNSD to expand services to improve the system level work of Family Wellness Plans/Plans of Safe Care.

The California Department of Public Health (CDPH) allocated State General Funds to expand the California Home Visiting Program (CHVP) and Orange County was previously selected to receive this expansion award based on the number of Medi-Cal births with three risk indicators (children under age 5 in poverty and/or foster care, and preterm births) and existing capacity to serve clients through a CHVP approved evidence-based services model, Nurse Family Partnership® (NFP). Grant funds will be used to support program operations including staff salaries, program materials, and operational expenses. Program goals include promoting maternal health and well-being, improving infant and child health and development, strengthening family functioning, and cultivating strong communities. Services are provided to pregnant and newly parenting families who have medical

and social risk factors such as inadequate income, education less than 12 years, substance use, depression and/or mental illness. NFP is staffed by Public Health Nurses within the Community and Nursing Services Division. Research has shown that evidence-based home visiting programs produce positive outcomes that save taxpayer dollars by reducing societal costs associated with intimate partner violence, youth crime, substance use, and need for governmental assistance.

The Health Insurance Counseling and Advocacy Program (HICAP) provides free, unbiased one-on-one counseling and community education to help eligible individuals understand their Medicare and related insurance coverage options and making it easier for the public to access the information they need to make informed decisions. California state trained and registered counselors offer personalized assistance to adults age 65 or older, as well as younger individuals with disabilities who are eligible for Medicare.

On August 12, 2026, the California Department of Aging (CDA) notified OC Community Resources/Office on Aging (OCCR/OoA) of an additional HICAP funding award of \$147,713, increasing the FY 2026-27 total allocation to \$805,318.

OCCR/OoA will use this additional funding to support standard program services, enhance staff training and development, and maximizing program reach and operational efficiency through improved tools and digital processes. This funding award will allow OCCR/OoA to expand counseling staff and reach more clients through consistent training and improved access.

On June 4, 2024, the Board of Supervisors approved the Memorandum of Understanding AAA-2425-22 (MOU) with the CDA and the Older Americans Act and Older Californians Act Program Guide (Program Guide), dated April 10, 2024, to allow for the CDA to directly allocate funding to the OCCR/OoA without the need to execute annual contracts or amendments. The MOU describes OCCR/OoA's obligations to perform work and services according to the requirements of the MOU and the Program Guide requirements.

The Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act (WIOA) helps connect people to jobs, training, education, and business support services through a coordinated workforce system. In Orange County (excluding Anaheim & Santa Ana), these services are delivered through the Orange County Workforce Solutions System, which includes the main American Job Center of California (OC Workforce Solution Center) in Brea, six affiliate locations (Laguna Niguel, Tustin Emergency Shelter, Los Alamitos Joint Forces Training Base, Mercy House Shelters, South County Field Services Office and the Mobile Unit). Each year, the State of California's Employment Development Department (EDD) announces new funding allocations for WIOA programs. These federal funds are distributed through subgrant agreements to local entities and have retroactive start dates because of differing state and federal budget cycles. Historically, WIOA funds have been distributed in two rounds during the program year, issued as modifications to the Subgrant Agreement. On July 23, 2026, OC Community Resources/Workforce & Economic Development Division (OCCR/WEDD) was notified of Round 1 allocation of \$6,913,517, which includes funding for the following programs: • Youth Program: \$4,310,600 • Adult Program: \$747,410 • Dislocated Worker Program: \$1,458,968 • Rapid Response Program: \$297,932 • Layoff Aversion Program: \$98,607 Once the WIOA Subgrant Agreement is executed, EDD may issue additional allocation funding for the listed programs or make other allocation funding modifications. 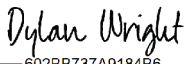

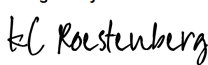

The County of Orange and participating jurisdictions will utilize FY25 Edward Byrne Memorial Justice Assistance Grant (JAG) funds to enhance public safety, law enforcement capabilities, and operational effectiveness throughout Orange County. The County of Orange, as the primary recipient, was awarded a total of \$548,175 to administer and monitor the grant, including the pass-through of direct allocations to participating subrecipient cities. Of this amount, \$22,045 is allocated directly to the County of Orange for the Sheriff's Department to support mobility and emergency response equipment at the Theo Lacy Facility, including wheelchairs and emergency transport litters, to address medical and accessibility needs within custody operations and support Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) compliance.

Participating cities were allocated the following JAG funding amounts: Anaheim, \$141,529; Buena Park, \$14,777; Costa Mesa, \$34,711; Fullerton, \$36,030; Garden Grove, \$32,816; Huntington Beach, \$33,655; Irvine, \$16,984; La Habra, \$14,705; Orange, \$17,151; Placentia, \$12,066; Santa Ana, \$12,066; Stanton, \$11,682; Tustin, \$13,985; and Westminster, \$24,084. Newport Beach was allocated \$11,442 but declined to participate in the program this fiscal year.

The subrecipient cities will use JAG funds for a range of public safety initiatives, including unmanned aerial systems, traffic safety equipment, tactical and officer safety equipment, real-time operations and mobile command capabilities, specialized training, digital forensic software, crime suppression overtime, staff wellness resources, surveillance technology, and police records support. Collectively, these projects will strengthen emergency response, investigative capacity, officer safety, and law enforcement operations while enhancing community safety across Orange County.

Round One Project: In Round One, the Orange County Sheriff's Department (OCSD) submitted an application requesting \$2,514,830 to support the Department's Regional Narcotics Suppression Program (RNSP), Highway Interdiction Team (HIT), and Human Trafficking Team (HTT). The requested grant funds will support seven dedicated law enforcement positions and overtime to address critical staffing shortages, expand proactive, intelligence-driven investigations, and enhance participation in regional and federal task forces. The project will strengthen OCSD's ability to investigate drug trafficking, human trafficking, money laundering, firearms offenses,

and other organized criminal activity while improving coordination with partner agencies on complex, multi-jurisdictional investigations.

Round Two/Round Three Project: As the next step in the BIDEN Program's competitive funding process, OCSD is seeking an additional \$935,170 per Rounds Two and Three, for a total of \$3,450,000 per round, to establish and support a Counter-Unmanned Aircraft Systems (C-UAS) program. C-UAS technology enables law enforcement to detect, track, identify, and mitigate drones used for unlawful or dangerous purposes. OCSD was among the first local law enforcement agencies to have a staff member complete the required federal training to operate this technology. The need for C-UAS capabilities has become increasingly evident during public safety operations and large-scale events. Acquisition of C-UAS equipment will strengthen OCSD's ability to detect and respond to emerging threats and support the objectives of the BIDEN Program by enhancing local law enforcement capabilities to address impacts associated with border-related crime, cartels, and transnational criminal activity.

The Sheriff-Coroner Department requests that the County Executive Officer place the subject grant application on the agenda for the August 25, 2026, Board of Supervisors Meeting. The Department also requests retroactive approval to apply for Round Two of the FY2026 Bridging Immigration-Related Deficits Experienced Nationwide (BIDEN) Program.

The U.S. Department of Justice (DOJ), Office of Justice Programs (OJP), announced this grant opportunity on June 15, 2026. The program offers three competitive application rounds, with a Round Two application deadline of August 26, 2026. The Board of Supervisors previously approved the Department's application for Round One of the FY2026 BIDEN Program on August 11, 2026.

For Round Two, the Department is submitting the initial step of the application on August 18, 2026, prior to the August 25, 2026, Board of Supervisors meeting. The Department is submitting the application early to allow sufficient time to upload the required documentation into the application system and provide the completed application for thorough internal review prior to the August 26 deadline. Because the initial application submission will occur before the Board meeting, the Department is requesting retroactive Board approval for the Round Two application.

The program provides three competitive funding rounds, allowing applicants up to three opportunities to compete for available funding before program funds are exhausted. The Department previously submitted a Round One application requesting \$2,514,830 to support the Orange County Sheriff's Department's (OCSD) Regional Narcotics Suppression Program (RNSP), Highway Interdiction Team (HIT), and Human Trafficking Team (HTT). For Round Two, the Department is seeking an additional \$935,170 to support a separate Counter-Unmanned Aircraft Systems (C-UAS) program, enhancing OCSD's ability to detect, track, identify, and mitigate threats posed by the nefarious use of unmanned aircraft systems. This brings the total amount requested for Round Two to \$3,450,000. Because the Department is increasing the total funding request from the amount previously approved by the Board, the Department is returning to the Board to request updated authorization.

The FY2026 Bridging Immigration-Related Deficits Experienced Nationwide (BIDEN) Program provides funding to strengthen law enforcement operations by supporting personnel, investigative activities, transportation, detention, logistics, and other resources that enhance public safety and combat violent crime, gang activity, and trafficking offenses. Round Two funding will allow OCSD to address emerging threats through the addition of C-UAS capabilities.
