**RE: County of Orange First District Funding**

Chairman Chaffee and Members of the Board:

Thank you for your continued support of local and regional projects that benefit Seal Beach and First District communities.

The City of Seal Beach has been fortunate to receive First District funding support from the County of Orange toward our San Gabriel River Trash Mitigation Initiative. The funds helped advance a feasibility study that is supporting the next phase of efforts to ultimately place a trash interceptor within the river system to help prevent debris from reaching the ocean. On May 13, the City of Seal Beach, alongside Orange County, Los Angeles County and the City of Long Beach, celebrated the partnership with The Ocean Cleanup for the implementation of trash interception projects within the San Gabriel River and Los Angeles River. We appreciated Supervisor Janet Nguyen representing the County of Orange's ongoing support as the project moves into the implementation phase.

This collaboration is a strong example of how partnerships between counties, cities, nonprofit organizations, and regional agencies can help address complex, multijurisdictional challenges that no single agency can solve alone. In addition to environmental initiatives, County partnership and funding support are also critical in helping local jurisdictions maintain and preserve aging infrastructure, including roadway pavement preservation projects that improve safety, extend roadway life, and reduce long-term maintenance costs for residents and taxpayers.

An example of a critical infrastructure program is OC RoadMAP. This program would create a channel for SB 1 Road Maintenance and Rehabilitation Account (RMRA) roadway improvement funds to reach Orange County communities by allowing local jurisdictions to access these funds and directly deliver eligible pavement preservation and roadway improvement projects.

For many local jurisdictions, County partnership and funding support play an important role in helping move meaningful projects from concept to implementation, especially for smaller cities like Seal Beach.

We appreciate the County's continued investment in First District 1 projects that improve environmental quality, protect our coastline, and benefit residents throughout the region.
