RECOMMENDED ACTION(S):

1. Approve the allocation of \$17,500 from the Fourth District discretionary funds for Orangeview Western 7-12 School’s Garden Re-Design Initiative.
2. Find under Government Code section 26227 that this expenditure is necessary to meet the social and educational needs of County residents.
3. Authorize and direct the County Executive Officer, or designee, to negotiate and enter into an agreement with Orangeview Western 7-12 School, Anaheim Union High School District, or its fiscal agent as necessary to effectuate the purposes of this allocation.
4. Authorize and direct the Auditor-Controller, or designee, to make related payments as necessary to effectuate the purposes of this allocation.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION:

Chairman Doug Chaffee requests the approval of \$17,500 in Fourth District discretionary funding to support the Orangeview Western 7-12 School Garden Re-Design Initiative in Anaheim. This student-led “Design-Build” project will revitalize the school’s underutilized garden space into an interactive educational environment that supports Career Technical Education (CTE), Special Education, STEAM learning, mental wellness, and community engagement. The initiative is led by students in the Product Innovation & Design pathway and supported by educators, community partners, and school leadership. The funding will support the implementation of Phase 1 of the Orangeview Western Garden Re-Design project, including ADA-compliant pathways, modular garden beds, seating and teaching areas, soil and plant materials, and other infrastructure improvements necessary to create a safe and accessible outdoor learning environment. The project will provide students with hands-on experience in design thinking, engineering, project management, budgeting, and community collaboration while creating a sustainable campus resource that benefits students, staff, and families throughout the Fourth District.
