RECOMMENDED ACTION(S):

1. Approve the allocation of **\$100,000 from Fourth District discretionary funds to Planned Parenthood of Orange and San Bernardino Counties (PPOSBC).**
2. Find under Government Code section 26227 that this expenditure is necessary to meet the social and educational needs of County residents.
3. Authorize and direct the County Executive Officer, or designee, to negotiate and enter into an agreement with Planned Parenthood of Orange and San Bernardino Counties, or its parent organization as necessary, to effectuate the purposes of this allocation.
4. Authorize and direct the Auditor-Controller, or designee, to make related payments as necessary to effectuate the purposes of this allocation.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION:

Chairman Doug Chaffee is providing funding support to Planned Parenthood of Orange and San Bernardino Counties (PPOSBC) to help maintain access to essential health care services for vulnerable and underserved residents of the Fourth District. PPOSBC is a 501(c)(3) community clinic that provides comprehensive health care services to populations vulnerable to poor health outcomes and currently serves more than 130,000 community members through nine service delivery sites in Orange and San Bernardino Counties. Funding will help support access to **general health care services, including primary care, mental health services, health screenings, laboratory testing, illness treatment, and chronic disease management**, particularly for residents who are underinsured, uninsured, or otherwise face financial barriers to care. During Fiscal Year 2025-26 through April 2026, PPOSBC reported **12,788 District 4 patients and 26,156 patient visits**, including 10,963 Medi-Cal patients and 21,493 Medi-Cal visits. This allocation will help PPOSBC continue providing high-quality health care and charitable care to District 4 residents who may otherwise face difficulty accessing timely and affordable medical services. PPOSBC reports that it provides nearly \$3 million annually in charitable care to underinsured and uninsured patients

who are unable to pay, and anticipates increased demand for this assistance due to rising household costs and health care expenses.
