RECOMMENDED ACTION(S):

1. Approve the allocation of \$10,000 from Third District discretionary funds to Orange County Public Works.
2. Find under Government Code section 26227 that this expenditure is necessary to meet the social needs of County residents.
3. Authorize and direct the County Executive Officer, or designee, to negotiate and enter into an agreement with Orange County Public Works as necessary to effectuate the purposes of this allocation, including, but not limited to, the allocation of funds.
4. Authorize Orange County Public Works to purchase rice/hay bales, rebar, and basic flood-prevention supplies to help protect homes and property from potential rain, flooding, stormwater runoff, and other emergencies during the upcoming wet season.
5. Authorize and direct the Auditor-Controller, or designee, to make related payments as necessary to effectuate the purposes of this allocation, including, but not limited to Cal-Card, electronic fund transfers or check payments.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION:

This allocation of \$10,000 from Third District discretionary funds to Orange County Public Works is purposed to purchase rice/hay bales and rebar for distribution to residents in the Canyon community to help protect homes and property from potential rain, flooding, and stormwater runoff during the upcoming wet season.

The supplies will be distributed to Canyon residents in coordination with a community town hall focused on emergency preparedness, planned for late October. The town hall will provide residents with information and resources to help prepare for potential winter weather, flooding, and other emergencies, while the rice/hay bales and rebar will provide residents with practical materials that can be used to help protect their properties from stormwater and flooding.

Providing these materials directly to Canyon residents will help ensure that community members have access to basic flood-prevention supplies before significant rainfall occurs. This effort will strengthen local emergency preparedness, support residents in taking proactive measures to protect their homes and property, and help the Canyon community prepare for the upcoming wet season.
