

ORDINANCE NO 10-001

**AN ORDINANCE OF THE COUNTY OF ORANGE, CALIFORNIA
ADOPTING SECTION 6-4-608 OF THE CODIFIED
ORDINANCES OF THE COUNTY OF ORANGE REGARDING
PARKING VIOLATIONS**

The Board of Supervisors of the County of Orange, California ordains as follows:

SECTION 1. Section 6-4-608 of the Codified Ordinances of the County of Orange is hereby adopted to read as follows:

“Sec. 6-4-608. Civil penalties for vehicle parking violations.

A violation of any provision contained in Sections 6-4-603(a)(1), (b), (d), (e), (f), (g), (h) or Section 6-4-606(a) shall be punishable by civil fine in an amount approved by the Board of Supervisors in the Orange County Uniform Traffic Bail Schedule.”

ORDINANCE NO 10-002

**AN ORDINANCE OF THE COUNTY OF ORANGE, CALIFORNIA
AMENDING SECTION 2-1-66 OF THE CODIFIED
ORDINANCES OF THE COUNTY OF ORANGE REGARDING
PARKING VIOLATIONS**

The Board of Supervisors of the County of Orange, California ordains as follows:

SECTION 1. Section 2-1-66 of the Codified Ordinances of the County of Orange is hereby amended to read as follows:

“Sec. 2-1-66. Enforcement as misdemeanor or infraction.

(a) A violation of any section contained in this Division, (except Section 2-1-30.10(a), (b)), may be deemed an infraction and may be punished as such, notwithstanding the fact that, at the discretion of the District Attorney, the violation of any section contained in this Division may be filed as a misdemeanor. The complaint charging such violation shall specify whether the violation is a misdemeanor or an infraction.

(b) Every violation determined to be an infraction is punishable by:

- (1) A fine not exceeding one hundred dollars (\$100.00) for the first violation;
- (2) A fine not exceeding two hundred dollars (\$200.00) for a second violation within one year of the first violation; and
- (3) A fine not exceeding five hundred dollars (\$500.00) for the third and each additional violation of the same ordinance within one year of the first violation.

(c) The County may commence civil actions or administrative proceedings against the offending person to enforce and/or prevent any violation of any section contained in this Division. Such actions may be in law or equity, and may seek injunctive relief, abatement of nuisance(s), and other equitable relief. Such actions may seek to recover any damages or expenses incurred by the County to remediate any environmental damage or repair any facilities damage due to any violation of this ordinance by any person. These damages and expenses include environmental remediation costs, facilities repair costs, loss of revenue, staff time, attorneys fees, court costs, and reimbursement, defense and indemnification for any fine or legal or administrative proceeding to which the County may have been exposed or for which the County may have become liable due to the actions of the offending person.

(d) The Airport Director may enact rules or regulations to enforce this ordinance. Such rules or regulations may include provisions for notices of noncompliance,

administrative compliance orders, cease and desist orders, abatement of nuisance, recovery of costs, administrative hearing process and other terms.

(e) Notwithstanding the foregoing, all parking violations as enumerated in Section 2-1-52 subdivisions (a) through (k) and Section 2-1-54(b), shall be punished by civil fine in an amount approved by the Board of Supervisors in the Orange County Uniform Traffic Bail Schedule.”

ORDINANCE NO. 10-003

**AN ORDINANCE OF THE COUNTY OF ORANGE, CALIFORNIA
AMENDING SECTION 2-5-3 OF THE CODIFIED
ORDINANCES OF THE COUNTY OF ORANGE REGARDING
PARKING VIOLATIONS**

The Board of Supervisors of the County of Orange, California ordains as follows:

SECTION 1. Section 2-5-3 of the Codified Ordinances of the County of Orange is hereby amended to read as follows:

“Sec. 2-5-3. Effect, enforcement and penalties.

(a) *Conditioned use of recreational area.* The privilege of any person to use parks, beaches and recreational areas is hereby expressly conditioned upon compliance by the person with the provisions of this division as they apply to such use.

(b) *Eviction.* In addition to other penalties provided for in the Codified Ordinances of the County of Orange, violations of any provision of this division shall subject the violator to eviction from the park in which the violation occurs and other parks if deemed necessary, all in accordance with the procedures in Section 2-5-20. This division shall be enforced by the Director, designated HBP Manager, and such of their agents as they may designate to perform said duty as well as by peace officers having jurisdiction of any area in which a violation of any provision of this division may take place.

(c) *Penalties.* In unison with Section 1-1-34 (General Penalties) any person convicted of violating a section of Division 2 or Division 5 within a park, beach or recreational area shall be guilty of a misdemeanor, except as otherwise provided herein. At the discretion of the District Attorney, prosecution of a complaint filed in violation of any section contained in this title that is designated as a misdemeanor may be reduced to an infraction.

(d) *The Nature Reserve of Orange County.* To deter damage to natural resources and prevent their recurrence, at the discretion of the District Attorney, bail may be doubled for all violations occurring in parks and recreation areas designated by the Board as part of the Nature Reserve of Orange County.

(e) *Civil Citation Enforcement Officers.* In addition to those persons otherwise authorized by law, Park Rangers employed by the County of Orange shall be designated as Enforcement Officers for the purposes of Title 1, Division 1, Article 2 of the Code and are authorized to issue civil citations as provided in the Code for any violation of Title 2, Division 5, except Sections 2-5-16, 2-5-18, 2-5-20, 2-5-29(a), 2-5-31, 2-5-36, 2-5-37, 2-5-38 and 2-5-50.

(f) *Civil fine schedule.* Unless otherwise specifically provided for by law, violation of any section of Title 2, Division 5, except Sections 2-5-16, 2-5-18, 2-5-20, 2-5-31, 2-5-36, 2-5-37, 2-5-38, 2-5-50 and 2-5-29, shall be punishable by:

- (1) A fine not exceeding fifty dollars (\$50.00) for the first violation;
- (2) A fine not exceeding one hundred fifty dollars (\$150.00) for the second violation of the same Code provision within a period of one (1) year; or
- (3) A fine not exceeding five hundred dollars (\$500.00) for each additional violation of the same ordinance within one (1) year.

Section 2-5-29 "vehicle regulation" violations shall be punished by a fine of thirty dollars (\$30.00) per occurrence, except violations of 2-5-29 subdivisions (b), (e), (f), (k), and (o) shall be punished by civil fine in an amount approved by the Board of Supervisors in the Orange County Uniform Traffic Bail Schedule."

This ordinance shall take effect and be in full force thirty (30) days from and after its passage and before the expiration of fifteen (15) days after the passage thereof, shall be published once in an adjudicated newspaper in the County of Orange.

ORDINANCE NO 10-004

**AN ORDINANCE OF THE COUNTY OF ORANGE, CALIFORNIA
AMENDING SECTION 2-5-16 OF THE CODIFIED
ORDINANCES OF THE COUNTY OF ORANGE REGARDING
PARKING VIOLATIONS**

The Board of Supervisors of the County of Orange, California ordains as follows:

SECTION 1. Section 2-5-16 of the Codified Ordinances of the County of Orange is hereby amended to read as follows:

“Sec. 2-5-16. Fees.

All persons and groups using camping, parking or other special facilities of recreational areas shall, prior to such use, pay such fees and deposits as may be established by resolution of the Board of Supervisors.

Violations of this provision shall be punished by civil fine in an amount approved by the Board of Supervisors in the Orange County Uniform Traffic Bail Schedule.”

ORDINANCE NO 10-005

**AN ORDINANCE OF THE COUNTY OF ORANGE, CALIFORNIA
AMENDING SECTION 2-5-103 OF THE CODIFIED
ORDINANCES OF THE COUNTY OF ORANGE REGARDING
PARKING VIOLATIONS**

The Board of Supervisors of the County of Orange, California ordains as follows:

SECTION 1. Section 2-5-103 of the Codified Ordinances of the County of Orange is hereby amended to read as follows:

“Sec. 2-5-103. Regulations.

(a) No person shall park or stand a vehicle in the parking facility except in an area specifically marked for parking, and shall not occupy more than one parking space.

(b) No person shall abandon a vehicle in the parking facility, nor allow a vehicle to be parked in excess of seventy-two (72) hours at any one time.

(c) No person shall leave a vehicle standing unattended or parked in the parking facility with the motor running.

(d) No person shall park or stand a vehicle at any time in any area of the parking facility posted as "No Parking At Any Time."

(e) No person shall park or stand a vehicle within fifteen (15) feet of a fire hydrant in the parking facility, or park in such a manner as to block access to a fire hydrant.

(f) No person shall repair, dismantle, overhaul or perform any mechanical work upon any type of vehicle, trailer or boat in the parking facility, except to replace or otherwise repair a tire or to make emergency repairs to enable such vehicle or boat to be removed to a proper place.

(g) No person shall park a boat, trailer, motor home or recreation vehicle of any kind from 12:00 midnight until 7:00 a.m. in the parking facility. Notwithstanding section 2-5-95, Article 5, of the Orange County Codified Ordinances, motor vehicles, other than motorhomes may be parked overnight; provided that no person shall park a motor vehicle of any type between the hours of 10:00 p.m. and 7:00 a.m. in the parking facility lying between Warner and Third. The Director may install any parking control devices in the parking facility between Warner and Third to enforce the no parking prohibition in this section.

(h) The Sheriff of the County of Orange and the Director, or their respective agents, may remove, at the owner's expense, any motor vehicle which is parked in the

parking facility in violation of this article. The vehicles shall be subject to a lien for the cost of removal.

(i) No person other than the physically handicapped shall park a vehicle in those spaces reserved for the physically handicapped.

(j) Any violation of provisions (a), (b), (c), (d), (e), (f), (g), and (i) shall be punished by civil fine in an amount approved by the Board of Supervisors in the Orange County Uniform Traffic Bail Schedule.”

ORDINANCE NO 10-006

**AN ORDINANCE OF THE COUNTY OF ORANGE, CALIFORNIA
AMENDING SECTION 2-7-22 OF THE CODIFIED
ORDINANCES OF THE COUNTY OF ORANGE REGARDING
PARKING VIOLATIONS**

The Board of Supervisors of the County of Orange, California ordains as follows:

SECTION 1. Section 2-7-22 of the Codified Ordinances of the County of Orange is hereby amended to read as follows:

“Sec. 2-7-22. Policy and enforcement.

(a) Vehicle parking at County parking facilities shall be permitted only in spaces designated for parking by appropriately marked lines, and pursuant to posted signs permitting or prohibiting parking.

(b) No person shall park a motor vehicle in any marked space in such a manner as to occupy more than one (1) space.

(c) Any violation of this section shall be an infraction punishable by civil fine in an amount approved by the Board of Supervisors in the Orange County Uniform Traffic Bail Schedule; and any peace officer or any regularly employed and salaried employee whose duties include directing traffic and/or enforcing parking laws and regulations of the County of Orange, or deputized parking personnel of the County of Orange, may enforce such regulation by the issuance of warning notices, citations or tow-away orders, by arrest, or by any combination thereof to violators. Removal of vehicles from County parking facilities shall be accomplished in accordance with California Vehicle Code sections 22850 through 22856 inclusive.”
