



**AMENDMENT NO. 16
TO
SUBORDINATE CONTRACT NO. MA-042-23010693
FOR
RE-ENTRY SUCCESS CENTER SERVICES**

This Amendment ("Amendment No. 16") to Contract No. MA-042-23010693 for Re-Entry Success Center Services is made and entered into on July 1, 2026, (the "Effective Date") between Project Kinship ("Contractor"), with a place of business at 1833 E. 17th Street, Santa Ana, CA 92705, and the County of Orange, a political subdivision of the State of California ("County"), through its Health Care Agency, with a place of business at 405 W. 5th St., Ste. 600, Santa Ana, CA 92701. Project Kinship and County may sometimes be referred to individually as "Party" or collectively as "Parties".

RECITALS

WHEREAS, Charitable Ventures of Orange County, Inc. ("CVOC") and County executed Contract No. MA-042-23010693 for Re-Entry Success Center Services, effective March 07, 2023, through June 30, 2025, in an amount not to exceed \$11,645,839 ("Contract"); and

WHEREAS, CVOC and County executed Amendment No. 1 to amend Exhibit A, Paragraph III. Payments, of the Contract; and

WHEREAS, CVOC and County executed Amendment No. 2 to amend the Contract to increase the Period Two Not to Exceed Amount by \$2,844,338 from \$5,107,402 to \$7,951,740 and Period Three Not to Exceed Amount by \$2,844,338 from \$4,807,402 to \$7,651,740, for a revised cumulative total not to exceed amount of \$17,334,515, and to amend the Budget, Payment, Services and Staffing Paragraphs in Exhibit A of the Contract; and

WHEREAS, the Parties executed Amendment No. 3 to transfer the rights and obligations under the Contract from Charitable Ventures of Orange County, Inc. to Project Kinship in order for Project Kinship to continue providing services to County in accordance with the terms and conditions of the Contract, effective the Date of Emancipation July 1, 2023; and

WHEREAS, the Parties executed Amendment No. 4 to amend Paragraph XV. and Paragraph XIX. and to add Paragraph XXXIII. and Paragraph XXXIV. to the Contract; and

WHEREAS, the Parties executed Amendment No. 5 to add Paragraph XXXV. and Paragraph XXXVI. to the Contract; and

WHEREAS, the Parties executed Amendment No. 6 to amend Exhibit A, Paragraph II. Budget and Paragraph VI. Staffing, of the Contract; and

WHEREAS, the Parties executed Amendment No. 7 to increase the Period Two Not to Exceed Amount by \$339,009 from \$7,951,740 to \$8,290,749 and the Period Three Not to Exceed Amount by \$680,831 from \$7,651,740 to \$8,332,571, for a revised cumulative total not to exceed amount of \$18,354,355; to amend Paragraph II. of the Contract; and to add Exhibit E and Exhibit F to the Contract; and

WHEREAS, the Parties executed Amendment No. 8 to amend Exhibit A, Paragraph VI. Staffing, and Exhibit E, Paragraph V. Services and Paragraph VI. Staffing, of the Contract; and

WHEREAS, the Parties executed Amendment No. 9 to add Paragraphs XXXVII. through XLII. to the Contract; and

WHEREAS, the Parties executed Amendment No. 10 to amend the Contract to decrease the Period One Not to Exceed Amount by \$89,070 from \$1,731,035 to \$1,641,965 and Period Two Not to Exceed Amount by \$609,825 from \$8,290,749 to \$7,680,924 and to increase the Period Three Not to Exceed Amount by \$698,895 from \$8,332,571 to \$9,031,466, with no change to the cumulative total not to exceed amount, and to amend Exhibit A, Paragraph II. Budget, Paragraph III. Payments, Paragraph V. Services and Paragraph VI. Staffing, of the Contract; and

WHEREAS, the Parties executed Amendment No. 11 to amend Exhibit A, Paragraph II. Budget, Paragraph III. Payments and Paragraph V. Services, of the Contract; and

WHEREAS, the Parties executed Amendment No. 12 to amend Paragraph VII., Paragraph XVII., Exhibit A and Exhibit E of the Contract and to renew the Contract for one year, effective July 1, 2025 through June 30, 2026, in an amount not to exceed \$7,988,233, for a revised cumulative total amount not to exceed \$26,342,588; and

WHEREAS, the Parties executed Amendment No. 13 to amend Paragraph II. Budget of Exhibit A and Exhibit E of the Contract; and

WHEREAS, the Parties executed Amendment No. 14 to amend Paragraph XIII. Indemnification and Insurance of the Contract; and

WHEREAS, the Parties executed Amendment No. 15 to amend Paragraph VI. Staffing of Exhibit A of the Contract; and

WHEREAS, the Parties now desire to enter into this Amendment No. 16 to amend Exhibit A and Exhibit E of the Contract and to renew the Contract for one year for County to continue receiving and Contractor to continue providing the services set forth in the Contract.

NOW THEREFORE, Contractor and County agree to amend the Contract as follows:

1. The Contract is renewed for a term of one (1) year, effective July 1, 2026 through June 30, 2027, in an amount not to exceed \$6,143,988 for this renewal term, for a revised cumulative total amount not to exceed \$32,486,576.
2. Referenced Contract Provisions, Term provision, Not to Exceed Amount provision, Contractor Tax ID, and Contractor provision, of the Contract are deleted in their entirety and replaced with the following:

“Term: March 7, 2023 through June 30, 2027

Period One means the period from March 7, 2023 through June 30, 2023

Period Two means the period from July 1, 2023 through June 30, 2024

Period Three means the period from July 1, 2024 through June 30, 2025

Period Four means the period from July 1, 2025 through June 30, 2026

- 3. Exhibit A, Paragraph I. Common Terms and Definitions, subparagraphs 59 – 61, are added to the Contract as follows:

“59. CalAIM means California Advancing and Innovating Medi-Cal and is a series of initiatives and reforms towards advancing and innovating Medi-Cal to create a more coordinated, person centered and equitable health system. This includes ECM and Community Supports.

a. Enhanced Care Management (ECM) is a statewide Medi-Cal benefit available to select members with complex needs.

b. Community Supports (CS) are services provided by Medi-Cal managed care plans (MCPs) to address Medi-Cal members health related social needs to help them live healthier lives and avoid higher, costlier levels of care.

1. Transitional Rent is a CalAIM Community Support that provides up to six months of rental assistance in interim and permanent settings to Medi-Cal eligible individuals who are experiencing or at risk of homelessness, have certain clinical risk factors and have recently undergone a critical life transition.

60. Housing Navigation means the process of assisting people in identifying housing options, resources and services.

61. Housing Navigators means the staff that work with individuals to help them find, move in to, and retain affordable housing. They also develop relationships with community partners, other service providers, and agencies offering housing subsidies, and property owners and managers. Navigators help individuals eliminate or reduce the impact of personal housing barriers such as criminal records, poor credit, or prior housing judgments due to evictions, as well as transportation needs, application fees, and/or utility payments.”

- 4. Exhibit A, Paragraph II. Budget, subparagraph A., of the Contract is deleted in its entirety and replaced with the following:

“A. COUNTY shall pay CONTRACTOR in accordance with the Payments Paragraph in this Exhibit A to the Contract and the following budgets, which are set forth for informational purposes only and may be adjusted by mutual agreement, in writing, by ADMINISTRATOR and CONTRACTOR.

5. Exhibit A, Paragraph II. Budget, subparagraphs C. is added to the Contract as follows:

“C. CONTRACTOR must comply with California Welfare and Institutions Code, section 5830, subdivision (c) (2) that states BHSA Housing Interventions cannot be used to cover housing services covered by a Medi-Cal Managed Care Plan. This includes CalAIM Community Supports Transitional Rent, which must be exhausted before BHSA Housing Interventions can support time limited interim settings.”

6. Exhibit A, Paragraph III. Payments, subparagraph A.6., is added to the Contract as follows:

“6. Period Five, initial payment of ten percent (10%) of the Period Five Total Budget Amount in this Exhibit A, and the first full monthly provisional amount of \$409,737, to be paid on July 1, 2026. Subsequent monthly provisional payments will be paid in arrears.

7. Exhibit A, Paragraph V. Services, subparagraph A.1., of the Contract is deleted in its entirety and replaced with the following:

“1. The facility shall include space to support the services identified within the Contract. The facility shall be open from 8:30 a.m. – 5:00 p.m. Monday through Friday. It is expected that the facility has the capability for twenty-four (24) hour access, with limited services capability after hours, to accommodate after hours release from custody.”

8. Exhibit A, Paragraph V. Services, subparagraph C.5., of the Contract is deleted in its entirety and replaced with the following:

“5. CONTRACTOR shall have re-entry services at the IRC and Theo Lacy nine hours a day, seven days a week, with the exception of approved holidays. The hours will be determined by the Health Care Agency. The re-entry teams are the bridge between treatment provided during incarceration and treatment services provided in the community to ensure linkage and continuity of care for a full spectrum of services.”

9. Exhibit A, Paragraph V. Services, subparagraph C.7., of the Contract is deleted in its entirety and replaced with the following:

“7. CONTRACTOR shall expand access and availability of housing resources for the re-entry population. Grounded in Housing First and Critical Time Intervention (CTI) principles, CONTRACTOR will provide immediate access to housing during critical time when an individual is most vulnerable to trauma, and supportive services, which are more intensive during critical period such as transitioning from jail. The RSC shall utilize Transitional Rent prior to utilizing the established flex funds to provide interim housing by way of shelter partnerships and rental assistance. The RSC Housing Coordinators/Case Managers will contact the 24-hour member access line to determine if the individual is moderately impacted by substance use concerns to ensure eligibility for Behavioral Health Services Act housing criteria. The RSC Housing Coordinators/Case Manager shall also participate in the Coordinated Entry System (CES) in order for clients to be matched to housing opportunities.”

10. Exhibit A, Paragraph V. Services, subparagraph C.9., of the Contract is deleted in its entirety and replaced with the following:

“9. COUNTY will leverage SAPT, MHSA, Public Safety Realignment, and the Continuum of Care (CoC) Federal Grant program to create housing opportunities for this target population. Leveraged funding will expand existing housing contracts with recovery residences and bridge housing which will provide dedicated beds for RSC Clients who are moderately impaired by a Substance Use Disorder. RSC will be a referral source for OC Community Resources (OCCR)/OC Housing Authority for tenant-based rental assistance for permanent housing through the CES system.”

11. Exhibit A, Paragraph V. Services, subparagraph G., of the Contract is deleted in its entirety and replaced with the following:

“G. PERFORMANCE OUTCOMES - CONTRACTOR shall, during the term of the Contract, be required to achieve, track, and report Performance Outcome statistics in programmatic reports, as identified below:

 - a) Thirty percent (30%) of individuals contacted through outreach will have completed a screening and assessment for program enrollment;
 - b) Fifty-five percent (55%) of client referrals will result in confirmed linkage;
 - c) Sixty percent (60%) of enrolled Clients will receive employment/education assistance by Contractor;
 - d) Fifty-five percent (55%) of enrolled Clients will receive housing assistance services by Contractor;
 - e) Eighty percent (80%) of enrolled Clients who need a higher level of care will receive a warm hand-off to behavioral health services; and
 - f) Seventy percent (70%) of enrolled Clients receiving mental health counseling services will report improvement in well-being and quality of life.”

12. Exhibit A, Paragraph V. Services, subparagraph H.2., of the Contract is deleted in its entirety and replaced with the following:

“2. CONTRACTOR shall also monitor and track demographic and other encounter information which includes but is not limited to:

 - a.) Date of Service
 - b.) Client name or Client identifier
 - c.) Age/Date of birth
 - d.) Race
 - e.) Ethnicity
 - f.) Gender
 - g.) Sexual orientation
 - h.) Language(s) spoken
 - i.) Military status
 - j.) Referring agency or individual
 - k.) Client enrollment status in BHS services at onset of RSC services
 - l.) Client enrollment status in BHS services at conclusion of RSC services

- m.) Additional community services offered to Clients
- n.) Referrals made and confirmed linkages
- o.) and other demographic data as requested by ADMINISTRATOR”

13. Exhibit A, Paragraph VI. Staffing, subparagraph A., of the Contract is deleted in its entirety and replaced with the following:

“A. CONTRACTOR shall, at a minimum, provide the following staffing pattern expressed in FTEs continuously throughout the term of the Contract. One (1) FTE shall be equal to an average of forty (40) hours work per week.

14. Exhibit E, Paragraph I. Common Term and Definitions, subparagraph 38., is added to the Contract as follows:

“38. CaAIM means California Advancing and Innovating Medi-Cal and is a series of initiatives and reforms towards advancing and innovating Medi-Cal to create a more coordinated, person centered and equitable health system. This includes ECM and Community Supports.

a. Enhanced Care Management (ECM) is a statewide Medi-Cal benefit available to select members with complex needs.

b. Community Supports (CS) are services provided by Medi-Cal managed care plans (MCPs) to address Medi-Cal members health related social needs to help them live healthier lives and avoid higher, costlier levels of care.

1. Transitional Rent is a CaAIM Community Support that provides up to six months of rental assistance in interim and permanent settings to Medi-Cal eligible individuals who are experiencing or at risk of homelessness, have certain clinical risk factors and have recently undergone a critical life transition.”

15. Exhibit E, Paragraph II. Budget, subparagraph A., of the Contract is deleted in its entirety and replaced with the following:

“A. COUNTY shall pay CONTRACTOR in accordance with the Payments Paragraph of this Exhibit E to the Contract and the following budget, which is set forth for informational purposes only and may be adjusted by mutual agreement, in writing, by ADMINISTRATOR and CONTRACTOR.

16. Exhibit E, Paragraph II. Budget, subparagraph D., of the Contract is deleted in its entirety and replaced with the following:

“D. CONTRACTOR must comply with California Welfare and Institutions Code, section 5830, subdivision (c) (2) that states BHSAs Housing Interventions cannot be used to cover housing services covered by a Medi-Cal Managed Care Plan. This includes CalAIM Community Supports Transitional Rent, which must be exhausted before BHSAs Housing Interventions can support time limited interim settings.”

17. Exhibit E, Paragraph II. Budget, subparagraphs E. and F., are added to the Contract as follows:

“E. In alignment with BHBH program requirements, those who are currently housed under BHBH on January 1, 2026 are allowed to remain housed under BHBH and are not expected to use Transitional Rent until the conclusion of BHBH funding on June 30, 2027. Individuals who are new to the BHBH program after January 1, 2026 are expected to use the Transitional Rent benefit where available before receiving BHBH funding.

F. CONTRACTOR and ADMINISTRATOR may mutually agree, in writing, to modify the Budget Paragraph of this Exhibit E to the Contract.”

18. Exhibit E, Paragraph III. Payments, subparagraph A.4., is added to the Contract as follows:

“4. Period Five, initial payment of ten percent (10%) of the Period Five Total Budget Amount in this Exhibit E, and the first full monthly provisional amount of \$51,062 will be paid on July 1, 2026. Subsequent monthly provisional payments in the amount of \$51,062 will be paid in arrears.”

19. Exhibit E, Paragraph IV. Reports, subparagraph A.4.2, of the Contract is deleted in its entirety and replaced with the following:

“2) CONTRACTOR shall submit narrative and data reports that document progress towards outcomes to ADMINISTRATOR quarterly and provide program updates and participate in monitoring and reimbursement review with ADMINISTRATOR as requested. The metrics will include, but not be limited to, the following:

- a) Number of people served;
- b) Demographic information;
- c) CARE Program participants receiving BHBH supportive services; and
- d) Bed-nights of bridge housing provided in each of the following:

20. Exhibit E, Paragraph V. Services, subparagraph B., of the Contract is deleted in its entirety and replaced with the following:

“B. PROGRAMMING

1. CONTRACTOR shall establish programming based on Housing First principles and shall include voluntary supportive services for participants. Consistent with the national Housing First model and WIC section 8255, abstinence from alcohol or other substances cannot be a requirement or prerequisite for housing funded by the BHBH Program; the use of alcohol or other substances in and of itself cannot be grounds for eviction; services are informed by a harm-reduction philosophy that recognizes drug and alcohol use and substance use disorder

as a part of participants' lives, where Participants are engaged in nonjudgmental communication regarding drug and alcohol use; and where Participants are offered education regarding how to avoid risky behaviors and engage in safer practices, as well as connected to evidence-based treatment if the individual so chooses. However, when indicated, funding may be used to support recovery residences and sober living environments for individuals with significant substance use disorder needs.

2. CONTRACTOR shall provide life skills and independent living skills training to facilitate the Participant's transition to an independent living arrangement such as: use of public transportation, grooming/hygiene, dressing for success, laundry, care and management of belongings, housekeeping, meal planning and preparation, making household or personal item purchases and money management, use of community resources, and leisure time management. Skills training may be provided in group and/or individual modalities.

3. CONTRACTOR shall provide medication support to include:

- a. Support access to medication assisted treatment (MAT) and psychotropic medications for the treatment of mental disorders;
- b. Encouraging Participants to know what medications and dosages they are taking and the importance of remaining compliant with medication as well as to help them recognize the potential side effects and dangers of combining medications with other substances;
- c. Providing proper medication storage.

4. CONTRACTOR shall assist Participants in developing skills to manage interpersonal behaviors that could interfere with their ability to remain independently housed within the community. This includes interacting with staff, housemates, and/or landlords, maintaining their personal space in good order, and being a good neighbor.

5. CONTRACTOR shall monitor for specific signs of psychiatric decomposition or relapse and be prepared to connect Participant to the appropriate level of services.

6. CONTRACTOR shall support Participants in setting up appointments, providing transportation to appointments and attending appointments with Participants.

7. CONTRACTOR shall have a network of resources that they can provide referrals and linkages to networks must include the resources listed below. Referrals and linkages to services and programs that address the needs of individuals shall be provided and facilitated on an ongoing basis.

8. CONTRACTOR shall assist Participant with any subsequent follow up from the appointment and/or access to supportive services thus reducing the likelihood for missed appointments and other recidivism, including but not limited to:

- a. Physical Health Care;
- b. Mental Health Care;
- c. Substance Use Treatment;
- d. Mainstream Benefits (e.g., Medi-Cal, SNAP, TANF, CalFresh);
- e. Employment Services;
- f. Legal Services;
- g. Credit Counseling;
- h. Education; and
- i. Essential services that address the needs of specialized

populations, including but not limited to transitional aged youth, victims of domestic violence, dating violence, sexual assault, or stalking, and veterans."

21. Exhibit E, Paragraph V. Services, subparagraph G., of the Contract is deleted in its entirety and replaced with the following:

“G. PERFORMANCE MEASURES AND OUTCOMES

1. CONTRACTOR shall report performance outcomes separately for Behavioral Health Bridge Housing Services.
2. Performance Outcome.
 - a. Ninety percent (90%) of Participants will be referred to City Net for housing navigation services within one week of placement.”

22. Exhibit E, Paragraph VI. Staffing, subparagraph F., of the Contract is deleted in its entirety and replaced with the following:

“F. CONTRACTOR shall, at a minimum, provide the following staffing pattern expressed in Full-Time Equivalents (FTEs) continuously throughout the term of the Contract. One (1) FTE shall be equal to an average of forty (40) hours work per week.
