RECOMMENDED ACTION(S):

1. Approve the allocation of \$6,000 from Fifth District discretionary funds to San Clemente Elks Lodge #2068 to purchase essential goods for military families served by the Pendleton Pantry. 2. Find under Government Code section 26227 that this expenditure is necessary to meet the social, public welfare, and basic needs of County residents and military families connected to Orange County. 3. Authorize and direct the County Executive Officer, or designee, to negotiate and enter into an agreement with San Clemente Elks Lodge #2068 as necessary to effectuate the purposes of this allocation. 4. Authorize and direct the Auditor Controller, or designee, to make related payments as necessary to effectuate the purposes of this allocation.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION:

Summary: Vice Chair Foley requests approval for the allocation of \$6,000 from the Fifth District discretionary funds to support San Clemente Elks Lodge #2068 in purchasing essential goods for military families served by the Pendleton Pantry.

Purpose of Funding: San Clemente Elks Lodge #2068 is a 501(c)(8) fraternal organization based in San Clemente with a history of supporting veterans, active duty military personnel, military families, and community service programs.

This funding will support the purchase of goods directly donated to the Pendleton Pantry at Camp Pendleton, which serves active duty Marines and their families facing financial hardship. The allocation will support shelf stable food, baby formula, diapers, wipes, personal hygiene products, household cleaning supplies, and other essential family necessities identified by pantry staff.

The Pendleton Pantry has experienced increased demand from military families facing rising housing, transportation, childcare, and everyday living costs. This allocation will help reduce food insecurity, support military spouses and children, maintain pantry inventory during periods of peak demand, and demonstrate Orange County's commitment to active duty service members and their families.
