**SUBJECT:** Allocation of \$500,000 to the City of Garden Grove

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**RECOMMENDED ACTION(S):**

1. Approve the allocation of \$500,000 from First District discretionary funds to the City of Garden Grove.
2. Find under Government Code section 26227 that this expenditure is necessary to meet the social needs of County residents.
3. Authorize and direct the County Executive Officer, or designee, to negotiate and enter into an agreement with the City of Garden Grove as necessary to effectuate the purposes of this allocation, including, but not limited to, the allocation of funds to the City of Garden Grove.
4. Authorize and direct the Auditor-Controller, or designee, to make related payments as necessary to effectuate the purposes of this allocation, including, but not limited to Cal-Card, electronic fund transfers or check payments.

**BACKGROUND INFORMATION:**

Supervisor Janet Nguyen would like to allocate one-time funding of \$500,000 from First District discretionary funds to the City of Garden Grove to provide relief to the residents affected by the GKN Aerospace hazardous materials incident.

The GKN Aerospace hazardous materials incident caused significant disruption to Garden Grove, Stanton, and surrounding cities, including evacuations, temporary displacement, business interruptions, and unexpected costs for residents. Many affected residents included seniors, families with children, individuals with medical needs, and working families who were forced to leave their homes with little notice.

The City of Garden Grove has been on the front line of the local response and is best positioned to coordinate relief efforts. This allocation will support the City’s ability to provide direct assistance and address community needs resulting from the incident within the evacuation areas.

The requested allocation will be used by the City of Garden Grove to assist impacted residents within the evacuation areas with eligible emergency and recovery-related needs, including but not limited to temporary lodging, food, transportation, medication, replacement of essential items, and other basic needs. The City of Garden Grove will coordinate with United Way to avoid duplication of benefits and prioritize County funds for eligible residents who were unable to receive assistance through United Way's OC Community Resilience Fund before it was exhausted.
