RECOMMENDED ACTION(S):

1. Approve the allocation of \$10,000 from Third District discretionary funds to Canyon High School Robotics Boosters, Inc.
2. Find under Government Code section 26227 that this expenditure is necessary to meet the social needs of County residents.
3. Authorize and direct the County Executive Officer, or designee, to negotiate and enter into an agreement with Canyon High School Robotics Boosters, Inc. as necessary to effectuate the purposes of this allocation, including, but not limited to, the allocation of funds.
4. Authorize and direct the Auditor-Controller, or designee, to make related payments as necessary to effectuate the purposes of this allocation, including, but not limited to Cal-Card, electronic fund transfers or check payments.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION:

I would like to allocate \$10,000 from Third District discretionary funds to the Canyon High School Robotics Boosters, Inc. to support the Canyon High School Robotics Program's efforts to become an official regional host for sanctioned robotics competitions.

Becoming a regional host will provide students and the local community with a dedicated venue for STEM education, innovation, and excellence. Hosting official competitions requires specialized infrastructure, including designated competition and activity areas, essential hardware, safety equipment, and operational resources.

This funding will help the Robotics Program acquire the necessary equipment and infrastructure to host regional competitions while creating reusable assets that can support the program for years to come. By investing in this effort, the County will help expand opportunities for students to develop technical skills, teamwork, problem-solving abilities, and hands-on experience in science, technology, engineering, and mathematics.
