County of Orange Report on Grant Applications/Awards

The Grants Report is a condensed list of grant requests by County Agencies/Departments that allows the Board of Supervisors to discuss and approve grant submittals in one motion at a Board meeting. County policy dictates that the Board of Supervisors must approve all grant applications prior to submittal to the grantor. This applies to grants of all amounts, as well as to new grants and those that have been received by the County for many years as part of an ongoing grant. Receipt of grants \$50,000 or less is delegated to the County Executive Officer. Grant awards greater than \$50,000 must be presented to the Board of Supervisors for receipt of funds. This report allows for better tracking of county grant requests, the success rate of our grants, and monitoring of County's grants activities. It also serves to inform Orange County's Sacramento and Washington, D.C. advocates of County grant activities involving the State or Federal Governments.

In July 2023, per Assembly Bill 102, the state of California appropriated funding to the Department of Industrial Relations to implement the Workers' Rights Enforcement Grant Program. This program is designed to protect workers from wage theft and other exploitative practices in the workplace. Activities may include evidence gathering, investigations, coordination with community organizations and law enforcement, prosecutions, resolutions, appeals and settlements.

Grant funds will support a specialized team consisting of a deputy district attorney, investigator and support staff

to identify, investigate and prosecute those who engage in wage theft in the private sector. A special emphasis will be placed on developing collaborative partnerships with community-based organizations that serve vulnerable populations, including victims of labor trafficking.

This memo is being submitted to request that the County Executive Officer place the subject grant application on the September 29, 2026, Board of Supervisors Meeting Agenda. OC Public Works (OCPW) requests retroactive approval for the Department of Pesticide Regulation 2027 Sustainable Pest Management (SPM) Grants Program opportunity.

OCPW was notified of the grant opportunity on August 27, 2026, with an application due date of September 1, 2026. Due to the timing of the grant notification and the limited application window, OCPW was unable to present the application to the Board for consideration prior to the submission deadline.

On September 1, 2026, an application was submitted for the San Juan Creek and Trabuco Creek Channels Pilot Project – Phase 2. If successful, this grant would provide additional funding to continue the Board directed pilot program to further evaluate alternatives to traditional vegetation management and reduce the routine use of pesticides. This pilot project aims to evaluate reduced herbicide use while maintaining flood capacity and quantify impacts related to creating a scalable model for managing OCFCD channels. The awarded grant will be used to test and assess a holistic and sustainable vegetation management approach for soft-bottom flood control channel maintenance that does not rely solely upon the use of chemicals.

The requested SPM grant is for \$1,000,000. OC Public Works plans to return to the Board with a request to accept funding if the grant application is awarded.

By using targeted manual methods and habitat restoration techniques, the pilot project aims to evaluate reduced herbicide use while maintaining flood capacity and quantify impacts related to creating a scalable model for managing Orange County Flood Control District channels. The project supports long-term, cost-effective, and environmentally responsible maintenance that benefits the residents of Orange County and other local agencies.

The total project cost is estimated to be \$1,176,496 and the application requested \$1,000,000 in SPM funds.

Naloxone is a life-saving medication used to rapidly reverse an opioid overdose. It works by blocking the effects of opioids at receptor sites in the brain and can restore normal breathing in an individual experiencing an opioid overdose. Naloxone has little to no effect on an individual if opioids are not present in their system and has few

known adverse effects.

The Naloxone Distribution Project (NDP) aims to address the opioid crisis by reducing opioid overdose deaths through the distribution of free naloxone, including its nasal spray formulation. The NDP is funded by the Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration (SAMHSA) and administered by the California Department of Health Care Services (DHCS). Naloxone is provided at no cost to eligible applicants to assist communities throughout California in preventing opioid overdose-related deaths.

The Probation Department previously applied for and was approved to receive 48 naloxone kits, with an estimated value of \$1,080, for use by Probation Field Services. Following further review of the Department's operational needs, the Department is expanding the availability of naloxone to all sworn Probation officers. In addition, naloxone kits will be strategically placed in central locations and with Automated External Defibrillator (AED) units to ensure they are readily accessible in the event of an opioid-related emergency.

The Department currently has approximately 620 naloxone units scheduled to expire in December 2026.

Naloxone nasal spray has a shelf life of approximately two years, making it necessary for the Department to maintain an ongoing supply and replace inventory as it approaches its expiration date. The additional request will help ensure that trained Probation personnel and designated Department locations continue to have access to naloxone without interruption.

To support this expanded distribution plan and address the Department's upcoming inventory expiration, the Probation Department is requesting an additional 816 naloxone units, with an estimated value of \$15,504. This request represents a non-monetary grant award, as no funding will be provided to the Department. The award will consist solely of naloxone products.

Only Probation personnel who have completed the required training and are authorized in accordance with applicable training guidelines and Department policies will deploy naloxone. The Department will maintain appropriate policies and procedures for the storage, inventory, tracking, distribution, and reporting of naloxone received through the NDP.

Expanding access to naloxone will enhance the Department's ability to respond promptly to suspected opioid-related emergencies and help protect the health and safety of Probation personnel and the youth and individuals served by the Department, including those in juvenile facilities. The requested additional units will help ensure that naloxone remains readily available as the Department's existing inventory approaches expiration and as the Department expands access to trained sworn personnel and designated locations.

The Sheriff-Coroner Department requests that the County Executive Officer add the subject grant application to the agenda for the Board of Supervisors meeting on September 29, 2026. The Sheriff also requests retroactive approval to apply for the FY2026 Comprehensive Opioid, Stimulant, and Substance Use Site-Based Program (COSSUP).

The Bureau of Justice Assistance released the Notice of Funding Opportunity for this program on August 17, 2026, with a Grants.gov application deadline of September 24, 2026. Due to the Grants Unit requiring additional clarification from the division regarding the appropriate grant amount to request, there was not sufficient time to obtain formal Board approval prior to the application deadline. To ensure the department did not miss the opportunity to compete for available funding, the application was submitted, and retroactive approval is now being requested.
