**RECOMMENDED ACTION(S):**

1. Reaffirm continued designation of the Chief Probation Officer as the Correctional Administrator of the Supervised Electronic Confinement Program in accordance with Penal Code 1203.016 and the Orange County Board of Supervisors' Resolution Number 89-425.
2. Review the Rules and Regulations and Administrative Policy of the Supervised Electronic Confinement Program in accordance with Penal Code 1203.016.
3. Authorize the County Procurement Officer or Deputized designee to execute Amendment Four with American Justice Solutions, Inc. dba CorrectiveSolutions, for the provision of Full Case Management Supervised Electronic Confinement Home Detention Program to renew the contract for an additional one-year term of July 1, 2026, through June 30, 2027, in the amount of \$1,200,000, for a revised cumulative total not to exceed amount of \$6,000,000.

**SUMMARY:**

Reaffirming the designation of the Chief Probation Officer as the Correctional Administrator supervising the Supervised Electronic Confinement program, reviewing the rules and regulations of the Supervised Electronic Confinement Program, and approving the contract with American Justice Solutions, Inc. dba

CorrectiveSolutions will allow continued full case management services under the Supervised Electronic Confinement Program and 24-hour monitoring of program Participants supervised by the Orange County Probation Department.

**BACKGROUND INFORMATION:**

Penal Code section 1203.016 (2024) authorizes the Orange County Probation Department’s (Probation) Chief Probation Officer, with the Orange County Board of Supervisors’ (Board) approval, to administer an electronic home detention program. Board Resolution No. 89-425 designates the Chief Probation Officer as the County Correctional Administrator for the Supervised Electronic Confinement (SEC) program. The SEC Program monitors low-risk, non-violent adult offenders outside of correctional facilities. The Chief Probation Officer has the sole discretion to determine acceptance of Participants into the SEC program.

American Justice Solutions, Inc. dba CorrectiveSolutions (Corrective) provides the following service components in its continuous electronic monitoring of SEC participants:

1. GPS monitoring, using BluTag, a one-piece ankle device from Satellite Tracking of People, LLC (STOP) and VeriTracks, a secure cloud computer-based application that receives, stores and distributes tracking data from BluTag at a STOP monitoring center in Houston, Texas. Case managers assigned by Corrective to the contract receive event notifications and 24-hour monitoring data, as well as implement response protocols prescribed by Probation.
2. Allied Universal Electronic Monitoring provides breath alcohol testing using the Secure Continuous Remote Alcohol Monitor (SCRAM) remote breath alcohol portable device that incorporates automatic facial intelligence.
3. Drug testing, performed by Redwood Toxicology Laboratory, Inc. under specified industry specifications and standards for urinalysis.

SEC Participants are allowed to work with certain restrictions. The primary goal of SEC is to allow an individual to keep their job and work to support themselves and their families, while serving a sentence.

**Data Metrics and Program Outcomes**

In the calendar year 2025, there were 787 Participants in the SEC program. The following tables provide the outcomes related to the SEC program. The first table shows the total number of exits from the SEC Program, along with the exit type.

The next table shows that Participants in the program generally have positive employment trends after participation in the SEC program. The employment status table provides a one-day snapshot of SEC Participants on December 31, 2025.

The last table provides a one-month illustration of the cost comparison between utilization of the SEC Program and serving days sentenced in Orange County Sheriff’s Jail Facilities. In December 2025, 69 Participants were active in SEC serving a combined total of 4,830 sentenced days. Using the FY 2025-26 Daily Bed Rate from the Orange County Sheriff’s Department, the cost of serving 4,830 days in jail would be over \$1.4 million compared to just over \$96,000 for the SEC Program, with net savings of over \$1.3 million.

Probation now requests the Board to reaffirm the continued designation of the Chief Probation Officer as the Correctional Administrator of the SEC Program in accordance with Penal Code 1203.016 and Board Resolution No. 89-425 and approve the SEC Program rules and regulations and administrative policy of the program in accordance with Penal Code 1203.016.

Additionally, Probation requests the Board’s authorization to execute Amendment Four to renew contract with Corrective, for a one-year term, for the period of July 1, 2026, through June 30, 2027, in an amount not to exceed \$1,200,000 for a revised cumulative amount of \$6,000,000. This is the final year allowed under this

contract, prior to the Contract's expiration. Probation plans to solicit for these services through the County's online bidding system in August 2026.

This contract includes subcontractors. See Attachment D for information regarding subcontractors and the Contract Summary Form. In order to add subcontractor(s) to the contract, the contractor must seek express consent from Probation. Should the addition of a subcontractor affect the scope of work and/or contract amount, Probation will bring the item back to the Board for approval.

The Contractor's performance has been confirmed as satisfactory. Probation has verified there are no concerns that must be addressed with respect to Corrective's ownership/name, litigation status or conflicts with County interests. An analysis was completed to verify the contract provides the County with specially trained, experienced, expert and competent to perform the special services in accordance with the law.

**FINANCIAL IMPACT:**

Appropriations for this Contract will be included in Budget Control 057 FY 2026-27 Budget and will be included in the budgeting process for future years. The Contract includes provisions that the Contract is contingent upon the availability of funds and inclusion of sufficient funds in the budget approved by the Board for each fiscal year the Contract remains in effect or operation. In the event such funding is terminated or reduced, the County may terminate the Contract, reduce the County's maximum obligation or modify the Contract, without penalty.
