VI.PUBLIC, CEO, BOARD COMMENTS & ADJOURNMENT

PUBLIC COMMENTS:

Hanna V - Oral re: Opportunity to promote health and welfare of the community with the budget; children living in poverty without enough to eat and increased unhoused population without access to water; People's Budget OC focuses on higher priority matters than public protection

Patrick C - Oral re: Increases in Sheriff spending over the past decade while residents are in need of community based resources; People's Budget OC opposes the proposed discretionary funding allocated to Sheriff's Department; taking money from Public Health and Social Services to pay for Sheriff salaries, benefits and overspending; opposes building of mental health jail

Brigitte - Oral re: Evil is deceptive; Plan-demic is not what it was said to be; testing is not effective; social distancing is a psy-op; virus was bio-engineered to turn our bodies into a transmitter to control you through your cell phone

Cally K - Oral re: Budget significantly overfunds public protection to the detriment of other programs; law enforcement is hyper-militarized fascism, not protection; prioritizing law enforcement is not the solution; moral character of officers; police and policies do not protect people

Bryan Kaye - Oral re: Mental health program does not help veterans and facilities are so bad people would kill themselves before going to them; Nate Tseglin being locked up and family wants him home; children locked up without evidence; parents want success for their children; ignored petitions

Name not provided - Oral re: Quote by James Madison; PCR testing is a scam; State is moving target guidelines for opening of businesses; rent control moratoriums; people aren't getting sick from COVID-19, it is the 5G towers causing bodies to grow exosomes and expel toxins as respiratory illness; resonance of oxygen in bodies is same frequency as 5G; military weapon ADS uses microwaves for crowd control

Rose Ochoa - Oral re: People's Budget OC hosting webinar to go over survey results and budget analysis; correct decades of over-investment in law enforcement and jails; prioritize community investments including public health and affordable housing, mental health and supportive services, children and youth, environmental conservation, climate change, anti-racist education, community and human relations, and rent relief

Felipe Nieves - Oral re: Adopt People's Budget OC; cuts of funding from public health and social services and doubled spending on Sheriff's; mental health jail beds and people cannot get better in a cage; mental health and substance use disorders lack access to services; jail is no place for people with mental health disorders

Daisy Ramirez - Oral re: People's Budget OC; unhoused population and expanding jail system; wide spread disparities in income and access to healthcare; lack of transparency and public participation in budget process; overfunding of public protection and underfunding public health and social services; commit more to community investment and community based services; stop mental health jail and invest in diversion programs

Lindsay - Oral re: Investment in jails is terrorizing and criminalizing black and brown neighbors and tearing families apart; stop psychological warfare; you cannot heal in the same place that broke you; innocent schizophrenic people dying at hands of OC Sheriff; jail cannot provide the same mental health services than those outside of jail; make mental health resources more available

Lorie S - Oral re: Prioritize health, mental health, social services and public health above public protection; police lack training to be mental health first responders leading to the unnecessary arrest of individuals; incarceration subjects individuals to further trauma of imprisonment; providing a safe place to live and food to eat and a supportive community are key pillars to their wellness

Felicity Figueroa - Oral re: Demand for 2020 Truth Act Forum date to be set and is overdue; need for transparency regarding how law enforcement is transferring community members to ICE custody during pandemic; detaining people in jail for ICE to pick them up is illegal under SB54; stop Musick expansion

Pat Davis - Oral re: Collusion continuing between Sheriff and ICE in jails; set date for 2020 Truth Act Forum; detaining people in county jails after their release date for ICE to pick them up is illegal

David Duran - Oral re: Approvals and votes of the Board directly affect human rights, human dignity and the capacity of individuals to prosper, have access to healthcare and contribute to community; continued increases in Sheriff's funding while maliciously unwilling to provide increased funding for community services; People's Budget OC demands social and economic justice be recognized
