Steve Rocco - Oral re: Mark McCain, son of Albertsons CEO, who framed him for a crime and murdered his family and friends died a felon and is in hell

[Russell Carter - Oral re: Provided information that he submitted to California Highway Patrol \(CHP\) related to](#) the search for the shooters in the Aiden Leos case by reconstructing the VIN number of the

vehicle from the photograph released; he was unaware of the reward until he saw an article in the paper and has been trying since then to see if he qualifies for a reward based on the information he provided to the CHP

Nick Kolev - Oral re: Was told the problem with his passport was resolved after Supervisor Sarmiento followed up; the Clerk-Recorder would not record his document and should provide more information to the public on what documents can be recorded

Cheryl - Oral re: Court ready evidence was presented; EIPCA filed peremptory writ of mandate; Judicial Watch case 2-24-CV3750; District Attorney received information; United Sovereign America served cease and desist letter; numbers reported by County and State do not match; ballots received after deadline

Iyla Tsegin - Oral re: Conservatorship over his son Nate is example of deep corruption in Orange County where conservator was paid \$158,000 per year for doing nothing for his son; resignation of Board members, judges, public defender and social workers who are all deeply corrupted

Bryan Kaye - Oral re: Letter from Kathy Chance thanking him for public comments at meetings, reporting of hate crimes and human trafficking; filing reports with the FBI

[Roseann - Oral re: OC Chair of New California State, election has until December 1st to cure ballots; machines](#) that were forced on voters can count votes 45,000 votes an hour yet it is taking more than two weeks to count ballots; bomb scare at Registrar of Voters led to evacuation of poll watchers but not the employees for 15 minutes so they can sneak in extra votes; voters choice makes elections unbelievable; investigate close races as soon as they are reported because patterns in reporting are consistent with an algorithmic result

Eileen McDermott - Oral re: Visited the Registrar of Voters to observe and the area where ballots are opened by machine had no cameras; drop boxes are not secure; election field supervisor said elections are secure

Carolyn - Oral re: Opt out of Voter's Choice Act; Registrar of Voters is still processing provisional ballots; return to 1-day precinct voting with paper ballots; save money by sending ballots only to those who request to vote-by-mail, not everyone

Shellie Okon - Oral re: The lack of faith in the electoral process is concerning and people need to work together to resolve; why can't the County form a team to look into the elections

Linda M - Oral re: In California the election is still going while Florida had their results reported in a few hours; duplication of ballots that can be scanned; waste of the unused ballots that are not returned, signature verification of those that are and no reimbursement from the state for the costs

George A - Oral re: Observation of election at Registrar of Voters; discovered that when he went to get his real ID at the DMV, his party preference had been changed to Democrat when the DMV submitted a voter registration during that process
