BOARD COMMENTS:

Supervisor Nguyen - Oral Re: Southern California Air Quality Management District voted against Rule 1111 and 1121 mandate requiring replacement of gas water heaters and furnaces with electric

alternatives; sentencing of former Supervisor Andrew Do who received the maximum sentence of sixty (60) months in prison due in part to the resolution and victim impact statement submitted by the County; encourages peaceful anti-ICE protests without violence or damage to businesses and properties

Supervisor Sarmiento - Oral Re: Sixty (60) months sentencing of former Supervisor Andrew Do pursuant to his plea agreement was disproportionate to the damage he did and the monies he misdirected to his daughter and others; thanked County Executive Office Budget Team for participating in townhall regarding the FY 2025–26 Recommended Budget; increased presence of Immigration and Customs Enforcement (ICE) and Homeland Security in Santa Ana creating fear because ICE is targeting day laborers and those appearing at immigration court hearings; law enforcement used pepper balls and rubber bullets on people peacefully exercising their First Amendment rights, including his son and a reporter; no reason for disproportional and militarized response

Vice Chair Foley - Oral Re: Oral Re: Encouraged everyone to vote in local cities elections including Newport Beach and Huntington Beach; concerned with militarized response to protests and protecting the rights of those peacefully exercising their right to assemble without violence; thanked Congressman Correa for talking with ICE administrators and for protecting the rights of those peacefully exercising their right to assemble without violence; sentencing of former Supervisor Andrew Do and indictment of Peter Pham; statement Andrew Do provided requesting leniency during his sentence blamed his actions on the Board of Supervisors; Judge Selna will hold Andrew Do and his daughter jointly responsible for restitution and hopes for full restitution of the money and costs incurred as a result of his corrupt actions; requested County Counsel maintain a itemization of costs that have incurred with regard to the forensic auditing of all contracts and expenses incurred by the County in order for the County to recover monies; invited everyone to attend Flag Day ceremony on June 14th, 2pm at Baby Beach in Dana Point

Supervisor Wagner - Oral Re: Sentencing of former Supervisor Andrew Do shows the system works and hopes full restitution is ordered; recognizes First Amendment right to protest without violence and hopes law enforcement will exercise appropriate restraint; thanked Santa Ana Police Department, OC Sheriff and County Executive Officer for keeping Board members informed

Chair Chaffee - Oral Re: Sentencing of former Supervisor Andrew Do and additional indictments forthcoming; recognized the justified outrage of community members and supports their right to safely protest peacefully with dignity; dedication and reopening of the Stanton and Brea Libraries and future reopening of La Habra Library; thanked County departments that participated in the Future Leaders Program held on Saturday, June 8

Bryan Kaye - Oral Re: County budget and lawsuit against District Attorney Spitzer resulting in \$3 million loss to the County plus costs of case to defend him; Supervisors have a duty to put constituents interests ahead of their own; capacity for basic human respect; Board uses the same hate and indifference as during the Holocaust

Deborah Donovan - Oral Re: Former Supervisor Do's mishandling of budget and accountability of his wife Judge Cheri Pham who presided over the courts; Supervisor Wagner's wife is a judge in probate

court where disabled and special needs individuals are stripped of their rights and money for profit; District Attorney cover-ups and retaliations are undeniable; insider relationships shielding misconduct; independent oversight is needed for probate and family courts; protections for families and special needs individuals to ensure public money and public power are not used to erase civil rights

Pricilla Medina - Oral Re: In-Home Supportive Services (IHSS) caregiver for her son and without IHSS, he would be in an institution costing the County more money; IHSS workers save the county money and deserve investment by the County

Luz Ceden0 - Oral Re: In-Home Supportive Services (IHSS) provider for her 91-year old mother and is a voice for thousands of IHSS workers in Orange County that want to be included in the budget and paid what they deserve

Ilya Tseglin - Oral Re: Corruption of the Board; pleading for his innocent son Nate Tseglin who was kidnapped by the mafia; Larry Landauer of the Orange County Regional Center, corrupted judges, social workers, PublicDefender and law enforcement who used false reports to kidnap Nate Tseglin for profiteering and medical experimentation
