Bryan Kaye - Oral Re: Abusive people need to be less abusive; Deputy District Attorney Alex Shaaban used false forged plea agreements; judge had to stop court hearing to evaluate Mr. Shaaban to determine if he was in danger of harming himself

Kate - Oral Re: Requests to move presentations to the end of the meeting; thanks Supervisor Nguyen for requesting review of procurement policies and procedures; Supervisor Wagner is too late for Secretary of State; Board vote for Agenda Item S35E and discussion with Registrar of Voters and District Attorney was weak and shameful; return to one-day voting, eliminate the Voters Choice Act, cast and count votes in precincts and require voter identification

Nick Kolev - Oral Re: Civil Engineer and Civil Rights Activist; Grand Jury report on hate and statutory duties of District Attorney to prosecute hate crimes; conflict of interest because District Attorney is Jewish and underserves Muslim minorities; no transparency in actions of the courts and Child Support Services; County Counsel favors secrecy, privacy and closing of the government procedures
