VI.PUBLIC, CEO, ADJOURNMENT & BOARD COMMENTS

PUBLIC COMMENTS:

Steve Rocco - Oral re: Three lawyers (Mahatma Gandhi, Ho Chi Minh and Fidel Castro) and 1 doctor (Che Guevara); the Americas, Africa and Asia got rid of the European colonists in the 1960s; five lawyers on the current Board of Supervisors; Proposition 187 in 1992 was found unconstitutional; Board does not enforce laws

Debbie Barba - Oral re: Volunteer at OC Animal Care since 2008; Andi Bernard, Director of OC Animal Care has implemented negative policies and procedures and reversed the progress at OC Animal Care; reinstate the trap, neuter and release program

Sharon Logan - Oral re: Logan vs. OCAC and shelter reform at OCAC; euthanasia of healthy adoptable animals needs to stop; placing dogs on the euthanasia list as a ploy for rescues and the public to get dogs out of the shelter; reinstate the trap, neuter and release program; open the shelter to the general public

Name not provided - Oral re: Money provided to companies who are not fulfilling their contracts

Lisa Avery - Oral re: Attorney; no response from emails sent to the Board regarding the OC Animal Shelter; allegations and reasons for keeping adoptions by appointment and not reinstating trap, neuter and release program; Board needs to oversee and require transparency and truth from the OC Animal Care staff to improve the situation at the shelter

Laura Lawther - Oral re: Misuse of taxpayer funds at OC Animal Care; shelter has no public viewing hours to look for adoptable or lost pets; shelter is overcrowded and healthy dogs are euthanized for kennel space; residents looking for lost pets are being turned away

Name not provided - Oral re: Registrar of Voters mailed more ballots than registered voters in the county; activity reports of all votes cast does not equal the certified results; avoid use of drop boxes

Joette - Oral re: Election fraud; Board is guilty of 18 U.S. Code 2381 (treason) and 18 U.S. Code 1031 (major fraud against the United States); poll books on the Internet are in violation of election law 19205; Hart machines are in violation of the closed box software election law 19402; asked why are there more votes than voters; return to in-person voting in precincts and paper ballots on election day

April Josephson - Oral re: Requested to meet with the Board members individually to address issues at OC Animal Care; requested an audit be conducted of the shelter and to replace Andi Bernard, Director of OC Animal Care

Victor Mendez - Oral re: Keeping rents affordable for seniors; negotiating a quality of life petition with the owner; requested the Board find solutions for homelessness

Name not provided - Oral re: Was brought to United States from Cuba and qualified for subsidy; has filed complaint regarding civil rights violation, human right and discrimination; would like to speak to Supervisor Wagner regarding personal complaint

Linda - Oral re: Concerns with OC Animal Care; reinstate public viewing hours at the shelter; intake of healthy animals at the shelter; reinstate the trap, neuter and release program; open the shelter to the general public; Zoom accessible board meetings to allow interaction to the Board and from the community

Bryan Kaye - Oral re: Welcomed Supervisor Sarmiento; communications with Supervisor Foley regarding forged plea agreements; legal system in Orange County is flawed

Nicholas Dibs - Oral re: Teacher; concerned with students committing suicide due to bullying on social media; technology addiction with students and AB2273; requested the County establish a digital youth wellness outreach committee to educate parents and young people regarding the harmful effects of blue light, technology addiction and the increase of suicides, isolation and sleep deprivation and to establish professional training standards
