VI. PUBLIC, CEO, ADJOURNMENT & BOARD COMMENTS

PUBLIC COMMENTS:

Steve Rocco - Oral Re: Happy Columbus Day; has a bullet in bedroom window from whirly birds and political murder of his family; ran for office against Andrew Do and Janet Nguyen; home invasions by the FBI without paperwork; was framed three times by organized crime which leads to death and the gates of hell; organized crime by Chapman University, UCI and Orange School District; property taxes double dipping paying for trash twice

[Michelle Rubio - Oral Re: Senior Labor Relations representative from OCEA representing the Health Care](#) Agency's Outreach and Engagement team providing services to homeless out on the streets and the significant risks they face in their work with individuals with mental health and addiction issues; employees petition for special assignment pay for the classifications listed in the petition

Julio Ventura - Oral Re: Staff Assistant for five years with the outreach and engagement team, petition for workers to receive special assignment pay reflecting the work and risks they face on a daily basis; building trust with most vulnerable to help them regain stability; their work meets the criteria for special assignment pay

Barbara Sepulveda - Oral Re: Mental Health Specialist for four years, experiences elevated risks and exposure; outreach and engagement workers engage with some of the most vulnerable people including those with severe mental health and substance abuse disorders who are often unpredictable and dangerous; hazardous risks include increased physical danger, communicable diseases, toxic substances and adverse weather; petitioning for special assignment pay to align compensation with the dangers of their work

Billy Polanco - Oral Re: Mental Health Specialist for five years; outreach workers meet people where they are and sometimes experience physical confrontations, assaults, verbal abuse and threats from the people they are trying to help creating a stressful work environment

Edward Darwin - Oral Re: Supervising Public Health Nurse for six years; outreach workers interact with a population that has limited access to health care increases the risk of communicable diseases such as tuberculosis, hepatitis, HIV/AIDS, Covid-19, Monkey Pox, MRSA and exposure to lice and scabies; outreach workers continued working during pandemic; Naloxone administration by outreach and engagement workers

Rosa Gonzalez - Oral Re: Mental Health Specialist and has been with the County for 20 years; responds to life threatening situations including eight successful reversals of Fentanyl overdose but the risks include accidental exposure to drugs and drug paraphernalia

Agatha Wise - Oral Re: Program Supervisor II for six years; as an outreach worker, she works outside in extreme temperatures including heat, cold and rain to help the most vulnerable during storms and along flood control channels

Gabby Diaz-Vallejo - Oral Re: Mental Health Specialist for two years; outreach and engagement team are first to respond to crisis situations at encampments and shelters and exposure to communicable diseases putting health at risk every day and should receive special assignment pay

Joana Corsaut - Oral Re: Mental Health Specialist for five years; outreach workers are often on scene first and helping while waiting for first responders to arrive; encounters requiring timely response of crisis stabilization, law enforcement or medical services to respond to crisis situations

Lorena Fisher - Oral Re: Mental Health Specialist for four years; outreach and engagement teams have to reach clients in hard to reach places including parks, remote trails, flood control channels and experience increased risk during travel or transporting clients

Thanh Nghi - Oral Re: Mental Health Specialist for three years; building trust with individuals struggling with abandonment, trauma or loss and struggling to survive with limited resources is very difficult making outreach and engagement an emotionally exhausting job that leads to staff burnout, compassion fatigue and secondary post-traumatic stress

Calvin Nguyen - Oral Re: Continued outreach and engagement work during the pandemic, even when exposure to Covid-19 put his family's health at risk including his elderly high-risk parents

Michael Marks - Oral Re: Fair compensation for hazardous work will maintain the workforce and attract qualified individuals

Michelle Ruiz - Oral Re: Crisis Stabilization Units receive higher compensation than outreach and engagement employees yet face similar conditions and challenges

Armin Salamati - Oral Re: Outreach and engagement support of homeless community puts own and family's health at risk due to exposure to communicable diseases; passion for this work diminishes without adequate compensation for the level of risk they face on a daily basis

[Stephanie Jeffcoat - Oral Re: Governor issued apology for California's contribution to slavery; urges support for](#) Proposition 6 on the ballot to end modern day slavery and exploitation of incarcerated individuals forced into labor; Proposition 6 makes work while incarcerated voluntary

Cathleen Pryor - Oral Re: Climate Action Plan should include incentives to connect to the power grid and reduce the distance energy must travel; utilize robots in fire fighting efforts to prevent injury to fire fighters entering burning structures

Chuck - Oral Re: Election integrity and problems with fraud and cheating by allowing dead people, dogs and ineligible people to vote; lack of chain-of-custody for mailed in ballots and post offices lose ballots; problems with ballot reconciliation and signature comparisons; California was never a slave state

Cheryl - Oral Re: Discretionary funds to non-profit Latino Health Access to pay for voter outreach yet they hosted a black-tie gala raising \$165,000; should give the money to poverty line residents to help them achieve the American dream, not registering people to vote

Ilya Tseglin - Oral Re: Demands resignation of Chairman and board members for ignoring and covering up corruption by Larry Landauer and OC Regional Center, for suppressing free speech and ignoring the public concern of election violations; kidnap and torture of his son

Kate - Oral Re: Only 23 people attended meeting that changed voting system in Orange County for millions of voters; voters do not want the Voters Choice Act; return to one-day precinct voting on paper ballots with hand counts and voter ID

Eileen McDermott - Oral Re: Welcomed Donald Trump to California at Coachella; the price of freedom is eternal vigilance; same issue today as throughout history; a true patriot will defend their country; 28 days until republic is restored

Bryan Kaye - Oral Re: Supervisor Foley \$1.2 million grant to businesses in Santa Ana and contacted the businesses who petitioned for money and some of them never received the grant money; provided evidence of crimes committed by Supervisor Foley and her friend Gassia Apgarian; mental health workers are not helping, just forcing people to take medication like the Nazi's did

Luz Cedenro - Oral Re: In Home Supportive Services provider caring for her 90 year old mother suffering dementia; IHSS caregivers need increased wages to continue providing care

John Spring - Oral Re: October 19 is the real American independence day which is the anniversary of Yorktown victory; mind control and permanent brain damage of young woman; found her on internet performing illicit acts; does not remember things due to brain tumor; calls are ignored by Child Protective Services

Roseann - Oral Re: Cease and desist letter regarding elections; AB969 allows Board to declare urgency statute to overturn the Voters Choice Act

Calvin - Oral Re: Create an election commission to look at discrepancies in elections; get rid of Voters Choice Act and return to one day precinct voting on paper ballots with voter ID, hand count results

Carolyn - Oral Re: Elections certified using inaccurate voter rolls; widespread distrust of machine counts; if County received Help America Vote Act (HAVA) funds it should either follow HAVA or return the funds

George - Oral Re: Oath of Office requires defending both the State and Federal Constitutions which guarantee citizens the right to vote; certification of uncertifiable election results is treason

Supervisor Sarmiento - Oral Re: Requested County Counsel to advise on rules regarding a Supervisor's failure to attend meetings and vacating their official duties; and what rule or measure could be implemented going forward to declare a County elected office vacant under similar circumstances
