Steve Rocco - Oral Re: Institutions, including Ivy League schools and Chapman University, faced lawsuits related to antisemitism and allegedly paid settlements in the millions; they are not anti-religion, they are against conservative religions; liberalism traces back to Abraham Lincoln and the Civil Rights Act of 1866 and a shift toward left-wing ideology; Karl Marx wrote the communist manifesto to do away with race, religion and culture

Greg Arrowsmith - Oral Re: Attended District 5 Career Fair; expressed expertise in environmental services, specifically barn owl nesting boxes; California Brown Act of 1953 ensures transparency from local government agencies; attempted to schedule an in-person meeting with Leon J. Page during the December 2, 2025 meeting which was declined since he represents and works for the Board; outlined taxpayer benefits that should be provided for the public by Mr. Page

[Brigitte - Oral Re: Called for turning the page on Leon Page, citing a case referenced in a subpoena and report](#) dated 5/24/22; claims judges (Monarch, Sherman, Shute, Brown, Bell, Anderson, Baytieh, Rowe) are ignoring wrongdoings; accusations against Andrew Do and his wife Judge Cheri Pham; alleged cover-ups involving the Public Guardian, CEO Risk Management, and the Internal Auditor and restraining order incident; convinced Vice-President Harris to initiate a recall and investigate under RICO; upcoming personal trial and public invitation

Ilya Tseglin - Oral Re: Threatened indirectly by the Director of the Orange County Regional Center Larry Landauer through his vendor Louis Pena regarding comments provided at Board meetings about corruption of the courts and the Orange County administration; manufactured reports provided by Mr. Landauer to Social Services Agency and Police regarding his kidnapped son

Name not provided - Oral Re: Concerns about the ACE Parking contract at John Wayne Airport; doubts expressed at April 23, 2024 Board meeting and Voice of OC article regarding ACE's bid to meet the airport's transportation needs and contract adjustments; ACE reduced staffing and vehicle availability; recommended to investigate why cuts were made despite the budget increase and to send staff to the airport unannounced to observe actual operations; detailed list of contractual violations was submitted to Supervisor Foley's office via Morgan Goldstein

Eileen McDermott - Oral Re: Claims that in the 2024 election, there were more ballots than registered voters; red hat with white writing provokes mental illness; true meaning of Christmas; St. Nicholas saved girls from human trafficking; childhood and values; frustration expressed over prolonged

discussions on homelessness at Board meetings; criticized Bob Page for making "nonsensical" remarks regarding election corruption

Nick Kolev - Oral Re: Santa Ana resident, civil engineer, and civil rights activist; addressed concerns about government transparency and privacy, particularly in the context of surveillance technologies; lack of transparency in the District Attorney's office under Tony Rackauckas, referencing a secret database called "TREAD" that was part of federal and state investigations; highlighted surveillance technologies Skydio, Flock and Stingray; urged transparency regarding funding and usage of these programs and calls for representatives from the Sheriff's Department to provide public updates; scenario involving GPS signals from NASA satellites being used to locate individuals with extreme precision via microwave bullets

Bryan Kaye - Oral Re: Expressed a mix of gratitude, apology, and confusion regarding his interactions with various individuals and public officials; commended Supervisor Foley for her role in stopping the use of Round-Up; apologized for being perceived as offensive; asked for clarity on why he is considered offensive and expressed a willingness to change and grow; noted positive relationships with friends of Board members, particularly within the Vietnamese community; well-wishes for the holidays and a declaration of love for all
