B.O. **COUNTY COUNSEL READ: ON A VOTE OF 4-0, WITH CHAIRMAN CHAFFEE, VICE CHAIR WAGNER, AND SUPERVISORS DO AND BARTLETT VOTING AYE, AND SUPERVISOR FOLEY ABSENT, THE BOARD AUTHORIZED COUNTY COUNSEL TO RETAIN THE LAW FIRM RING BENDER LLP TO ASSIST THE OFFICE OF COUNTY COUNSEL IN POTENTIAL LITIGATION ARISING FROM A RECENT, MINOR (AND NOW SEEMINGLY CONTAINED) OIL LEAK IN THE TALBERT FLOOD CONTROL CHANNEL IN HUNTINGTON BEACH. THE OIL LEAK WAS DISCOVERED ON OCTOBER 6, 2022, WHEN AN ORANGE COUNTY FLOOD**

CONTROL DISTRICT CONTRACTOR WAS DRIVING SHEET PILE INTO THE TALBERT FLOOD CONTROL CHANNEL WALL AND STRUCK AND RUPTURED AN ABANDONED, BURIED CHEVRON CRUDE OIL PIPELINE, LEADING TO THE RELEASE OF AN ESTIMATED 500 GALLONS OF CRUDE OIL INTO THE CHANNEL. RING BENDER LEAD ATTORNEY JEFFREY RING'S HOURLY RATE IS \$495/HOUR, AND ATTORNEY PATRICK "KIT" BOBKO'S HOURLY RATE IS \$450/HOUR

PUBLIC COMMENTS:

[Ian Jameson - Oral re: California Leftists for Freedom](#); Respiratory Syncytial Virus (RSV) is not an emergency; Moderna's press release last year regarding fast-tracking new vaccine for RSV and coincidental announcement by Pfizer regarding their RSV vaccine the day before the County declared a state of emergency for RSV; data shows Covid vaccines caused RSV in children during vaccine trials; cases happening in hospitals now were caused by the Covid vaccine; end the state of emergency for Covid and RSV

Len Beckman - Oral re: 56 signers of the Declaration of Independence and 56 days until hearings begin on what has happened over the last few years; Covid vaccine is the greatest medical malpractice in history; good science is most important; so much is built on fake and faulty science; important to start listening to each other

Brigitte - Oral re: Don't need vaccinations; six years ago on election day a businessman Donald Trump beat Hillary Clinton and same day the Board attempted to silence the public by co-mingling public comments; County criminal mafia organization covering up for County attorneys, the Public Guardian and Public Administrator removed Quitclaim deed from a trust, falsified official recorded documents and forced conservatorships

Ilya Tseglin - Oral re: Honored to speak after other members of the public; reason for coming to every meeting is to plead assistance for son Nate who was kidnapped three times by Social Services in order for OC Regional Center to steal public funding reserved for his son's services; Son was abducted, neglected, abused, isolated, tortured and forcibly addicted to dangerous drugs

Michelle - Oral re: Forgives members of the Board; grace changes the hearts of evil persons; when we forgive we free the other person but we also set ourselves free; practice forgiveness

Laura M - Oral re: Supervisors say they are here to serve but have instead contributed to mental health issues, housing crisis and small business losses based on policies blindly following misinformation and disinformation from the CDC and the FDA; no emergency declaration for a disease that has 0% death rate and highly treatable; Remdesivir causes problems and symptoms similar to snake bites

Cheryl - Oral re: Serious problems with election processes; Registrar of Voters (ROV) says they have no authority to confirm citizenship; ROV should be shut down for violating sanctity of votes; the Board of Supervisors holds the purse strings over the ROV; Voters Choice Act is a voters cheat act

[Dawn Thomas - Oral re: Witnessed fraud as an observer on 6/8/22](#); was women's overall body building champion; studied science and health since childhood; daughters child was vaccinated and got very sick; Pfizer employees asked to go to Wuhan; Gavin Newsom is a warlock

Joette - Oral re: Supervisors absent during public comments; fraudulent elections where there were more votes than voters; movie 2000 Mules proved ballot boxes allowed ballot trafficking; clean up voter rolls; violations of election laws, major fraud and corruption; Board calling meeting with less than 72 hours notice is a violation of law

David - Oral re: Opposes state of emergency for another healthcare non-crisis; people are fearful that this will lead to more mandates; extreme to declare state of emergency for crowded hospital beds and Board should come up with a different solution

Bryant Rumbaugh - Oral re: Phrase "In God We Trust" shows that God's law is above the rest; laws of common sense, grammar; respect, morality and truth; truth has been escaping the public; Constitution gives three opportunities to vote; cannot waive the consent of the governed; left state refund card to show people are not interested in inflation

Kim Sorgente - Oral re: Feedback from public means the public does not support this; freedom of speech for people to come tell the Board what is going on; secret meetings to push some agenda; this Board is failing the people and have not served them well; keep your hands off the kids and hands off everything; optics are terrible

Kathleen - Oral re: The extended voting centers are empty; drop boxes are not being collected because gas is too expensive; election process costs \$16 million; return to one day in-person voting with voter ID means the County could save millions of dollars; one person one vote; be the light for election integrity for California

Mrs. A - Oral re: Cause morality was approved; Karen Kingston proves that emergency use authorization does not work; cannot vote for emergency use; now vaccine has been approved we can know what they put in the vaccines; head of Moderna was arrested by the White House; patents on what is in gene therapies

Roseann - Oral re: Orange County Chair for New California State which will be the 51st state; Vice President of Finance for New California State is Chris Street who advises that erroneous reporting on financials show that California is actually on brink of bankruptcy because revenues are down 42%
