Name not provided - Oral re: City of Anaheim Police Department and police brutality during peaceful protests by vehicular assault; defund police

Name not provided - Oral re: Increases in Sheriff funding while cutting funding to Health Care Agency and Social Services Agency; Deputy compensation increases; unfunded pension liabilities; communities of color are underfunded

Name not provided - Oral re: August 11th Law Enforcement Appreciation Day; Black Lives Matter movement; officers endanger black and brown lives every day; Santa Ana and Anaheim police deadly force incidents; funding cuts to community services while doubling funding for Sheriff and raises for deputies

Name not provided - Oral re: Cop appreciation day and support for blue lives of Smurfs; should support health care heroes or houseless person help-out day; support Black Lives Matter movement instead of corrupt police gang culture

Ilya Tseglin - Oral re: Special interests taking up the public's time and reducing the time for public to speak; lack of justice and corrupted courts

Robert Tseglin - Oral re: Nate Tseglin probate case; kidnapped by police and placed in unlicensed group home; allegations of abuse, concealed medical records

Ahmed Abdalia - Oral re: Difference of ideologies; San Francisco police do not respond to mental health calls and instead send social workers or send homeless outreach to answer homeless calls; need more homeless advocates, not more police; social workers and mental health care

Brianna C. - Oral re: Increase in positive COVID-19 cases among children within the first two weeks of schools reopening is evidence that prevention needs to come before testing; severity of cases in children with pre-existing health conditions; higher chances of asymptomatic transmission and transmission to high-risk families

Lorie S. - Oral re: Militarization of police and equipment has increased firepower beyond what is necessary to protect communities and dangerously escalates situations that need not result in violence; police see themselves at war with the communities; need more collaborative style of policing

Name not provided - Oral re: Does not believe Board Members listen to the people; police appreciation is unnecessary; police using bombs and bullets on people holding cardboard signs and bullhorns

Kevin W. - Oral re: Police appreciation day is not needed, all first responders and emergency responders matter; disrespectful to honor cops given the current climate; what's happening in Portland will happen within two weeks in California

Lyndsey Lafebvre - Oral re: Medicare for all legislation and equitable health justice

Julian Gutierrez - Oral re: Psych-ward converted to COVID-19 unit reduced number of patients; passing anti-mask policies and opening schools; spending monies on police helicopter when they already receive more than 56% of the budget instead of helping those who actually need it

Kim Sorgente - Oral re: Real pandemic is child sex trafficking; police are criminals; country needs leaders who protect house and home

Brigitte - Oral re: Board out of touch with the people; Grand Jury report on hangar in Tustin; El Toro Marine Base used to pad pension of crony; quitclaim base property to cities

Bryan Kaye - Oral re: Raising funds to feed law enforcement agencies; denying basic human services and decency to public speakers

Name not provided - Oral re: Feels like she is being ignored but will continue to come to meetings to speak; Black Lives Matter

Felicity Figueroa - Oral re: Requested date be set for Truth Act Forum and transparency on how law enforcement transfers individuals to ICE custody in the middle of pandemic; public has a right to know if there has been illegal collusion between the two entities

David Duran - Oral re: Malicious neglect continues and demands the entire Board of Supervisors immediately resign so someone more qualified can replace the Board; Courtyard shelter across from new \$400 million County headquarters building while homeless deaths double throughout Orange County; moving funds from Health Care Agency to cover Sheriff overruns

Pat Davis - Oral re: Asked how Law Enforcement Appreciation Day is being celebrated; staged photo ops while refusing to acknowledge Black Lives Matter; housing first works; names of homeless who have died
