Angie Nguyen - Oral Re: In-Home Supportive Services (IHSS) provider for twelve years in District 1 and United Domestic Workers of America (UDW) member; Supervisor Nguyen is failing providers in her district and needs to stand with them.

Maria Chavez - Oral Re: In-Home Supportive Services (IHSS) provider in District 2 and United Domestic Workers of America (UDW) member; IHSS providers are underpaid and clients suffer when providers leave; Supervisor Sarmiento has the power to ensure caregivers are treated with respect
